

# ROUND 2 SMALL BUSINESS & NONPROFIT GRANT NOW OPEN

Round 2 of the Sacramento County Small Business & Nonprofit Grant Program is now open. Small businesses and nonprofit organizations adversely affected by the Covid-19 pandemic are invited to apply.

The application is available through the <u>sac4smallbiz.org</u> <u>website</u> and will close on December 15, 2022, at 5pm.

Funded with a portion of the County's American Rescue Plan Act allocation, the County Board of Supervisors has approved this Program to support 750 small businesses and nonprofit organizations with grants of \$10,000 in one-time financial assistance. Grant funds for this Program can be used to reimburse small businesses and nonprofit organizations for costs related to the negative economic impacts they experienced due to the COVID-19 pandemic and related health and safety restrictions.

To be eligible, applicants must operate from a commercial location within the unincorporated County, received \$2.5M or less in annual gross revenue in 2020, and have 25 or less full-time equivalent employees. Applicants can check whether their address is within the unincorporated County online on the Assessor Parcel Viewer.

# THE CALIFORNIA INTERNATIONAL MARATHON RETURNS

The 39th annual California International Marathon is back this year. Thousands of runners are expected to be racing through our neighborhoods in the Third District on **Sunday, December 4**, during the annual **California International Marathon** organized by the Sacramento Running Association. The 26.2-mile grueling trek begins at 7:00am in Folsom and concludes at the State Capitol.

Fair Oaks Boulevard is a big part of the route, so Fair Oaks, Carmichael and Arden Arcade residents south of that roadway may find themselves "land-locked" while the race is in progress. Please be cognizant of the closures when planning your morning activities. Residents can view specific street closures on the marathon's website.



# SACRAMENTO INTERNATIONAL NAMED TOP NATIONAL AIRPORT

Sacramento International Airport (SMF) was named the top airport in the nation according to the <u>Wall Street</u> <u>Journal's</u> 2022 Airport rankings. Compared to the 50 other airports surveyed, SMF received the highest score overall.

The top 50 busiest airports were surveyed and then divided into two sizes - 20 large and 30 midsize. The airports were then measured on 19 categories including experience from ontime performance and security waits to customer-satisfaction scores and ticket prices. The categories ranked were further grouped into three broad categories – reliability, convenience, and value.

SMF ranked highest among all airports surveyed in the reliability category and also ranked high in arrival and departure times, low flight cancellations, quick taxi and security clearance times, and a max walking distance of only 1,213 feet.

In 2019, SMF similarly won the top midsized airport award - the award was not issued in 2020 or 2021 due to the pandemic.

The Sacramento County Department of Airports is responsible for planning, developing, operating and maintaining the county's four airports: Sacramento International

<u>Airport</u>, <u>Executive Airport</u>, <u>Mather Airport</u> and <u>Franklin Field</u>. For more information, visit sacramento.aero.



# FIRST INSTALLMENT OF PROPERTY TAXES DUE 12/12

The deadline for paying the first installment of your 2022-2023 Sacramento County property taxes is coming up very soon. Payments are due no later than Dec. 12, 2022. Late payments will incur a 10 percent penalty for each tax bill. Partial payments are not accepted.

Payment must be received in the Tax Collector's Office by 5pm on Dec. 12, 2022, postmarked with a legal postmark, or paid through our website by Dec. 12, 2022. The Tax Collector also wants to remind property owners to include the appropriate installment payment stub from the tax bill or website or write the parcel number of the property on the check being submitted to make sure that you receive proper credit for the payment.

Payment may be mailed to P.O. Box 508, Sacramento, CA 95812-0508. Be sure to mail your payment early enough to ensure a timely postmark and avoid penalties.

#### **Making Payments**

Property taxes may be paid by online e-check or credit card through <u>Sacramento County's Online Property Tax Bill</u> <u>Information System</u>, or over the telephone at 1-844-430-2823, using the 14-digit parcel number. For a 2.29% convenience fee, a contractor will process your credit card payment if you elect to pay the annual property tax bill using this method. This convenience fee is not revenue to the County. There is no fee to make a payment via e-check.

To avoid penalties, transactions made either on the internet or over the telephone must be completed before midnight on the payment pay-by date. Please plan ahead and do not wait until the last minute to make your payment. If you are unable to get through on the internet or telephone, causing you to miss the payment deadline, penalties will NOT be waived. Please verify your data entry very carefully when making online payments. If your payment is rejected by your financial institution FOR ANY REASON, you will be charged a \$53.00 return payment fee as well as penalties if your payment is rejected after the due date.

Payments may also be made in person at the Tax Collector's Office, located at 700 H Street, Room 1710, Sacramento, CA 95814. The convenience fee to pay by credit card is 2.29% and the fee to pay by pin debit is \$1.95. If you elect to pay in the office and have your payment stubs (coupons), you may go directly to the cashier located in Room 1703.

If you use your bank's Online Bill Pay service, a paper check will be printed and mailed to the Tax Collector. Because the check is sent without a payment stub, please enter the parcel number, current year's bill number and installment being paid in the online account number field for payment identification. The date on the check issued by your bank is considered the postmark, so make sure you are aware of the bank's timeline for issuing the check. Some banks take 5 to 7 business days before the check is issued, and penalties will apply if the check is dated after Dec. 12, 2022.

#### **How to Obtain Information About Your Tax Bill**

If you have not received a tax bill, you can obtain your tax bill information and payment stubs (coupons) at the <u>Tax</u> <u>Collector's website</u>, over the automated telephone system or by contacting the Tax Collector's Office at (916) 874-6622.
