INTERNET CRIMES AGAINST CHILDREN

The Sacramento Valley Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) Task Force completed a three-day undercover chat operation, where undercover Detectives posed as children 13 years old (and younger) and were solicited for sex online. The operation resulted in 24 arrests and utilized nearly 100 officers from 21 different law enforcement

agencies including the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office, Rancho Cordova Police Department, Sacramento County District Attorney's Office, Citrus Heights Police Department, Sacramento Police Department, California Highway Patrol, California Department of Justice, Sacramento County Probation, and the Federal Bureau of Investigation – Sacramento, Homeland Security Investigations, among others. Suspects were arrested for various crimes including contacting a minor with the intent of sex (Felony); harmful matter sent to a child (Felony); arranging a meeting with a minor (Misdemeanor); attempting lewd act with a child under the age of 14 (Felony); lewd acts with a minor by force or fear (Felony); attempted child pornography production (Felony); and illegal possession of assault weapon (Felony).

ICAC and the many law enforcement groups work tirelessly to protect our children from predators. It is vitally important for the public to be aware of crimes being committed against the most vulnerable members of our community and for parents to keep an eye on their kids, family, and friends about what they're doing online.

ALCOHOL BAN KEEPS PARKWAY FAMILY-FRIENDLY DURING MEMORIAL DAY HOLIDAY WEEKEND

If you are planning to enjoy the American River Parkway over the Memorial Day holiday weekend, there will be a complete ban on alcohol consumption and possession both on land and in the water between Hazel and Watt avenues (an exception exists for Ancil Hoffman Golf Course).

Several years ago, there were major problems along the American River due to excessive alcohol consumption. This

resulted in fights, public nudity, profanity, and littering, and drove many families away.

In addition to Memorial Day weekend, the alcohol restriction also applies on the weekends of Independence Day and Labor Day. In addition, the Board of Supervisors delegated authority to the Director of Regional Parks, in consultation with the County Executive, to prohibit alcohol in the Parkway on any additional days between Memorial Day and Labor Day when such a ban is needed to maintain order when excessive alcohol consumption is encouraged by social media.




WHAT ARE YOUR KIDS DOING THIS SPRING AND SUMMER?
