REVISED RECOMMENDED BUDGET HEARINGS SET

The Sacramento County Board of Supervisors will begin Fiscal Year (FY) 2024-25 Revised Recommended Budget hearings on Wednesday, Sept. 4, at 9:30 am in Board Chambers in the Sacramento County Administration Building, located at 700 H Street, Sacramento, 95814. If necessary, hearings will continue on Sept. 5 and 6 at the same time and location.

The hearing schedule, in order (may be subject to change):

- IHSS Public Authority Budget Deliberation and Approval
- Introduction by the County Executive to the FY 2024-25 Revised Recommended Budget
- Public Comment
- Board Deliberation and Approval to Revisions of the Approved Recommended Budget

The numbers in the recommended budget change between June and September when the County receives new information, including the impact of the State Budget and updated revenue totals. Because of that new information, the Revised Recommended Budget comes back to the Board for review and adoption in September.

The Board of Supervisors approved the FY 2024-25
Recommended Budget on June 5. The \$8.8 billion
spending plan recognized new or enhanced areas of
growth, based on the Board's priorities and a survey of
Sacramento residents.

Included in those increases was funding to Health Services of \$28.4 million primarily for Behavioral Health Services; an additional \$5.7 million to Child, Family and Adult Services primarily for Child Protective Services; an increase of \$4.2 million to Human Assistance for childcare payments to CalWORKS participants and a position in Veterans Services; an additional \$3.9 million to the Sheriff's Office for a mobile command vehicle, required software and body-worn cameras; an increase of \$3.4 million to Correctional Health for a Medication Assisted Treatment Program, pharmacy positions and a new electronic health record system; and an additional \$1 million to Homeless Services and Housing to fund beds at a planned Safe Stay Community and three new positions, among others.

Members of the public may attend the hearings and be heard on any item in the budget, either <u>publicly or through</u> <u>written comments</u>. The budget hearings will also be telecast live on Metro Cable 14 and on the web.

METRO FIRE FALL BASIC CLASS

Metro Fire Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) is conducting its **Fall Basic Class**.

The purpose of the (CERT) Basic Training is to provide the individuals who complete this course with the basic skills they will need to respond to their community's immediate needs in the aftermath of a disaster when emergency services are not immediately available.

Participation in the Metro Fire CERT program is open to anyone who lives or works in the response area of the

Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District or within Sacramento County.

So far in 2024, Metro Fire CERT members have volunteered over 3500 hours. We have provided community education and stand-by first aid at many community events in Sacramento County. Over 500 of those hours were in direct support of Metro Fire either during severe weather events or during fire incidents.

The first step in joining any CERT is to complete a CERT Basic class.

Metro Fire's Fall Basic Class begins on **September 26th**. **The deadline to register is September 20th**.

SACRAMENTO COUNTY RECEIVES ADDITIONAL BEHAVIORAL HEALTH BRIDGE HOUSING FUNDING

Sacramento County Behavioral Health Services (BHS) was notified of a conditional award of \$15 million as part of the latest round of funding from the California Department of Health Care Services' (DHCS) Behavioral Health Bridge Housing (BHBH) Program. This award is part of a broader initiative by the State which awarded nearly \$133 million to 10 County behavioral health agencies to provide temporary, safe housing and essential support for people transitioning from homelessness to permanent housing.

This new funding builds on the success of the first round of BHBH funding, in which Sacramento County received \$43 million. With the initial funding, the County developed two main strategies to address behavioral health and housing challenges. First, the County invested in 100 Safe Stay beds dedicated to individuals experiencing both homelessness and behavioral health issues. Currently, 80 BHS dedicated beds are open. There are 56 beds at the East Parkway campus, and 24 beds are located at the Florin Safe Stay campus. There are currently 20 BHS Safe Stay beds under construction at the Stockton Safe Stay campus.

The second strategy involves collaborating with community-based organizations in Sacramento County to generate innovative ideas for transitional housing. On July 9, 2024, the County, approved adding approximately 135 beds for individuals with behavioral health challenges, including sober living programs. These beds are in various phases of construction.

With this additional round of funding awarded to Sacramento County, BHS will support the construction of 66 new Safe Stay beds for the Watt Safe Stay Campus. In total, with all funding, BHBH will support the addition of 301 beds for individuals experiencing homelessness with behavioral health conditions.
